ORDINANCE No. 15-2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 225 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MULLICA ENTITLED TRASH COLLECTION, DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has adopted regulations regarding trash collection, disposal and recycling, and;

WHEREAS, the Township Committee is desirous of amending such regulations for efficiency, equity, and financial stability.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF MULLICA TOWNSHIP that the following section of Chapter 225 be amended:

SECTION 225-2.3 Collection container requirements:

- C. The refuse container shall be of galvanized metal or of plastic composition, shall have a tight-fitting lid or cover, shall have two sturdy handles or one single cross-bar handle for wheeled carts, and shall not exceed 50 pound or for up to and including forty-eight gallon containers or-336 pound for ninety-six gallon wheeled cards. A maximum of two (2) 48 gallon containers, three (3) 32 gallon containers or one (1) 96 gallon container may be placed at the curb for collection. Containers shall not be allowed to collect or retain rainwater. The collector may, at its discretion, refuse to collect refuse in any container in which exceeds the gross weight limits. Wooden, cardboard, composition paper, fiber, or similar containers are specifically prohibited for use as refuse containers. The collector may, at its discretion, refuse to collect refuse in such prohibited container or remove such container and dispose of it as refuse.
- F. The Township of Mullica shall collect two bulk items per week month, per household during the regularly scheduled <u>first</u> trash pickup <u>of the month</u>. Bulk items shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight. Appliances and white goods shall be disposed of in accordance with the Township of Mullica's recyclable program.
- J. All refuse, except trade waste, hazardous waste, medical waste, construction debris, dead animals and animal waste accumulated in the Township shall be collected, conveyed, and disposed of by the Township or its duly authorized contractor for such purposes (collectively, the "contractor"). No other person shall collect, convey over any of the streets or alleys of the Township or dispose of any refuse accumulated in the Township, except in strict compliance with the provisions of this article and any other applicable law, rule, regulation, or ordinance

225.5. Solid Waste collected outside of Township limits; separation of waste from residential and nonresidential uses.

A. No solid waste shall, at any time, be collected outside of the Township of Mullica and disposed of within the Township of Mullica. No person, firm or corporation, whether acting as contract, agent, employee, collector, or owner, shall dump, deposit, site-separate or dispose of any garbage, animal matter, refuse, rubbish, debris, salvage or any other

waste material in or upon any lands anywhere within the Township of Mullica.

- B. No person shall bring, cart, remove, transport, collect, store, deposit or site-separate any solid waste, whether garbage, paper, ashes rubbish, waste materials, construction debris, bulk items, hazardous waste or trade waste, from outside the Township of Mullica for the purpose of dumpling or disposing thereof.
- C. No person, firm or corporation shall bring, cart, remove, transport or collect any trade waste, waste materials, construction debris, hazardous waste or bulk items from a nonresidential user and place same for collection with the solid waste of a residential user and, in those locations where residential and nonresidential users are located on the same premises, the solid waste shall be disposed of separately and in accordance with this article.

225.6 Violations and penalties

A. Unless any provision of this Code or state statute provides for a different penalty, violations of any provision of this article shall be punishable by a fine of \$250. Each day a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

SECTION 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to such action, subsection, paragraph, clause or provision and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication in the manner required by New Jersey law.

ORDINANCE #16-2025

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MULLICA ESTABLISHING A LIMITED AND SPECIFIC AREA LEAF COLLECTION PROCEDURE FOR STORMWATER COLLECTION DRAINS

WHEREAS, the Mullica Township Department of Public Works has requested an Ordinance to establish a procedure for collection of leaves within a limited and specified area to a stormwater collection drain.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Mullica, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Limited Area Leaf Collection Procedure.

- A. The Township does not provide Township wide bulk leaf collection. The Department of Public Works will only collect leaves from any property within 200 yards of a stormwater collection drain. Only leaves in that area will be collected. Leaves from any other part of a property owner's property will not be collected if placed in this 200-yard area. The Township stormwater drains which are the subject of this Ordinance are identified on the Map attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.
- B. Leaves shall be placed curbside or at least fifty (50) feet from the center of the right-of-way.
- C. Leaves shall be placed at least 10 feet from any storm drain inlet. Leaves shall not be bagged and shall be free of all other yard debris including sticks, twigs, acorns and other type trash.
- D. Leaves shall not be placed in the street. Any leaves placed in the street will not be collected and it is the property owners responsibility to remove the leaves immediately upon notice from the Township Public Works Department.
- E. Collection of leaves through this procedure will only take place from December 1st through December 5th of each year, weather permitting. If a date changes, it will be identified on the Township website.
- F. No vehicles shall be parked on the street in the area where the leaves are to be collected. Any vehicles parked in these areas will prevent the collection of the leaves during the limited time period and those leaves will not be collected.

Section 2. Violations.

Placement of leaves not in compliance with these conditions will not be collected and is a violation of this Ordinance. Leaves placed in the street which are not immediately removed after notice from the Township Public Works Department is a violation of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Enforcement.

- A. This Ordinance may be enforced in the Municipal Court for the Township of Mullica upon a Complaint being filed by the Public Works Director, Code Enforcement Officer or the Police Chief or his/her designee.
- B. Once a Complaint has been issued the responsibility for the disposal of the leaves shall lie with the violator.

Section 4. Penalties.

- A. Any person violating or failing to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine of \$250.00 for the first offense, \$500.00 for the second offense and up to \$1,000.00 for each subsequent offense.
- B. All persons allowing or permitting the continuation of any violation of this Ordinance shall also be subject to punishment for each separate offense as provided herein. A continuation of any violation for more than 1 day shall constitute a separate offense for each successive day.
- <u>Section 5.</u> All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, are inconsistent with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.
- <u>Section 6.</u> Should any section, subsection, part, clause or phrase of this Amended Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to that end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, the County received a LEAP Implementation Grant in the amount of \$57,375.00, from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs for the purchase of three (3) highway digital message boards; and

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>28th</u> day of October 2025, in the County of <u>Atlantic</u>, State of New Jersey, By and Between the **Southern Coastal Regional Employee Benefits Fund** referred to a "FUND" and the governing body of the Township of Mullica duly constituted LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT, hereinafter referred to as "LOCAL UNIT".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of various local units of government, as defined in N.J.A.C. 11:15-3.2, have collectively formed a Joint Insurance Fund as such an entity is authorized and described in N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et. seq. and the administrative regulations promulgated pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, the LOCAL UNIT has agreed to become a member of the FUND in accordance with and to the extent provided for in the Bylaws of the FUND and in consideration of such obligations and benefits to be shared by the membership of the FUND;

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The LOCAL UNIT accepts the FUND's Bylaws as approved and adopted and agrees to be bound by and to comply with each and every provision of said Bylaws and the pertinent statutes and administrative regulations pertaining to same.
- 2. The LOCAL UNIT agrees to participate in the FUND with respect to health insurance, as defined in N.J.S.A. 17B:17-4, and as authorized in the LOCAL UNIT's resolution to join.
- 3. The LOCAL UNIT agrees to become a member of the FUND and to participate in the health insurance coverages offered for an initial period, (subject to early release or termination pursuant to the Bylaws), such membership to commence on <u>January 1, 2026</u>, and ending on <u>December 31, 2028</u>, at 12:01 AM provided, however, that the LOCAL UNIT may withdraw at any time upon 90 day written notice to the FUND.
- 4. The LOCAL UNIT certifies that it has never defaulted on payment of any claims if self-insured and has not been cancelled for non-payment of insurance premiums for a period of at least two (2) years prior to the date of this Agreement.
- 5. In consideration of membership in the FUND, the LOCAL UNIT agrees that it shall jointly and severally assume and discharge the liability of each and every member of the FUND, for the periods during which the member is receiving coverage, all of whom as a condition of membership in the FUND shall execute an Indemnity and Trust Agreement similar to this Agreement and by execution hereto, the full faith and credit of the LOCAL UNIT is pledged to the punctual payments of any sums which shall become due to the FUND in accordance with the

Bylaws thereof, this Agreement or any applicable Statute. However, nothing herein shall be construed as an obligation of the LOCAL UNIT for claims and expenses that are not covered by the FUND, or for that portion of any claim or liability within the LOCAL UNIT retained limit or in an amount which exceeds the FUND's limit of coverage.

- 6. If the FUND in the enforcement of any part of this Agreement shall incur necessary expenses or become obligated to pay attorney's fees and/or court costs, the LOCAL UNIT agrees to reimburse the FUND for all such reasonable expenses, fees, and costs on demand.
- 7. The LOCAL UNIT and the FUND agree that the FUND shall hold all moneys in excess of the LOCAL UNIT's retained loss fund paid by the LOCAL UNIT to the FUND as fiduciaries for the benefit of FUND claimants all in accordance with N.J.A.C. 11:15-3 et. seq.
- 8. The FUND shall establish and maintain Claims Trust Accounts for the payment of health insurance claims in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et. seq., N.J.S.A. 40A:5-1 and such other statutes and regulations as may be applicable. More specifically, the aforementioned Trust Accounts shall be utilized solely for the payment of claims, allocated claim expense and stop loss insurance or reinsurance premiums for each risk or liability as follows:
 - a) Employer contributions to group health insurance
 - b) Employee contributions to contributory group health insurance
 - c) Employer contributions to contingency account
 - d) Employee contributions to contingency account
 - e) Other trust accounts as required by the Commissioner of Insurance
- 9. Notwithstanding 8 above, to the contrary, the FUND shall not be required to establish separate trust accounts for employee contributions provided the FUND provides a plan in its Bylaws for the recording and accounting of employee contributions of each member.
- 10. Each LOCAL UNIT of government who shall become a member of the FUND shall be obligated to execute an Indemnity and Trust Agreement similar to this Agreement.
